A Dutch-made *kussenkast* (ca. 1650) with connections to the Elting family and Huguenot Street is on loan from the Historical Society of Newburgh Bay and the Hudson Highlands.

This year marks 100 years since the US entered World War I on April 6, 1917, after President Woodrow Wilson asked Congress to declare war on Germany. Kingston, like many other communities, sent men and women to serve in the Great War. One section of the current exhibit highlights Kingston's part in World War I including a video by J. Peter Roberts that contains images from the FHK Archives, the William Anderson Carl Collection, and the Samuel Bernstein Collection. The exhibit includes an original drawing entitled Columbia by Edwin Howland Blashfield, commissioned by Woodrow Wilson (Item loaned from American Legion Post 150, Kingston, NY). This drawing was featured on the Columbia Certificate, which honored soldiers wounded and killed in World War I. Also presented: Memorabilia from Kingston's William Anderson Carl (1896 -1985) who enlisted in the Army ambulance corps in 1917 and served in France where he earned the prestigious medal of merit known as the Croix de Guerre. Upon, he became the owner of the Fessenden Shirt Company and bought the Gerret Van Keuren House on Green Street. He and his wife, Mary Elizabeth Montjoy Carl (1911-2006) later became founding members of the FoHK and he served as a member of Kingston's Historic Landmarks Preservation Commission.
